2. The receiving institution will send its decision within 4 weeks.
3. A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than 5 weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI. *[It should normally not exceed five weeks according to the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education guidelines]*
4. Termination of the agreement

In the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be given. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September 2019 will only take effect as of 1 September 2020.

Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict.

University of Camerino grading system

Italian grading system is based on numerical marks which may vary between 18 and 30:

18-19 is the minimum pass grade,

marks between 20-24 correspond to a satisfactory performance

marks between 25-27 correspond to a good performance,

marks between 28-29 correspond to a very good performance ;

30 corresponds to full marks and a distinction (lode) may be added to this maximum grade as

a mention of special merit .

For mobility where statistical distribution of grades is not available the University of Camerino will apply an internal conversion table.







